

Cat House Assembly Instructions:

You will need a bag of sand and straw (not hay or pine straw) you can get both at a Home Depot, Lowes, or Tractor Supply.

Put sand or gravel in the bottom of the big container, about 15 lbs. It is to weigh down the house.

Put straw on top of the sand. When done the level should make the bottom of the holes in the two house entrances line up. Tape the inner container to the wood entrance to snug it up and keep it dry.



Put the smaller house in and put straw loosely around the sides. You don't want the sides to bow.

Put straw in the smaller house, at least 8 inches thick, and sprinkle it with baking soda, which is a natural anti-microbial.

Sprinkle catnip in there if you think they won't go in the house, it attracts them.

Put the lid on the smaller house and put more straw on top. Put the lid on and duct tape it shut really well.

That's it! Just clean the smaller bin out and replace the straw and baking soda every couple of months.
